Parting out of Tri-Pacer: Sold 2 seats from the Tri-Pacer. Ads have been up for 2 weeks.

Chapter Hanger: Received one quote, for slab, for \$27,000. We are still waiting on a couple more quotes. Bruce Bemer is in possession of the site plans.

New Business
