MINUTES OF MEETING OF EAA CHAPTER 1310 APRIL 14, 2021

The meeting was called to order by President Glenn Lees at 7:40 PM

A quorum was present.

There were no minutes of the last on-line meeting.

The treasurer's report was given by Secretary Jack Swift by way of Zoom. The report was accepted. Details of the report will be available.

There were no committee reports.

President's Report and New Business:

- There was a discussion on whether we should plan a fly-in breakfast. Because of Covid protocols there will be new food handling responsibilities and the need for more help in the way of servers. There cannot be an open buffet style meal, and condiments and utensils have to be single serve.

There cannot be any self-serve drinks or things like syrup bottles or pitchers. Anything that could be touched by more than one person will have to be served. It was decided that we will plan to hold a breakfast on May 29th with a rain date of the 30th. Memorial Day Weekend.

(Edit: Since the meeting, Connecticut rules have changed. We will have our standard procedures with some additional cleaning and washing available. Seating will be outdoors so we can space people better.

- There will be an Airport Clean-up day on the 24th of April.
- An offer was made to buy the Cougar project for a \$300.00 donation. The offer was accepted.
- An offer was made to buy the un-airworthy 65HP Continental engine parts for a donation of \$200.00. The offer was accepted.
- An outdated spray gun that was donated at one time to the chapter was sold for \$50.00.

Old Business:

There was a discussion on the hangar project. Will we, and how will we proceed?

Jack Hilditch asked about the status of the steel framework that was begun. He also commented about the flight simulator frame, where is it, someone must know since it would require more than one person and someone with knowledge of the location of the key.

Jim Wysocki asked about a grant for tool purchase and the welder raffle. The raffle is over and the 30% tool reimbursement is still available with approval. There was a discussion of what tools may be useful to the chapter as a whole and a set of scales and a prop balancer were mentioned.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:29 PM.

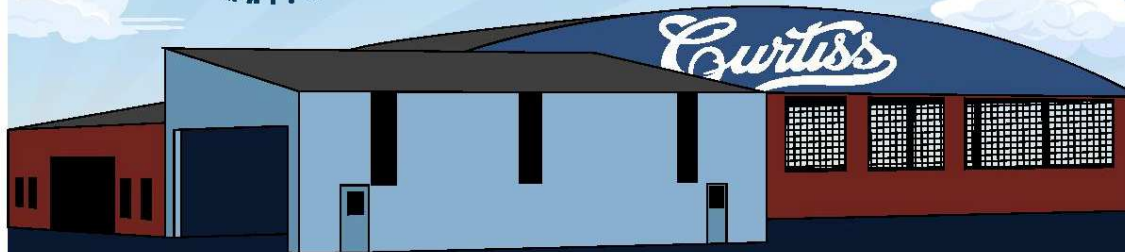

EAA AeroEducate Program

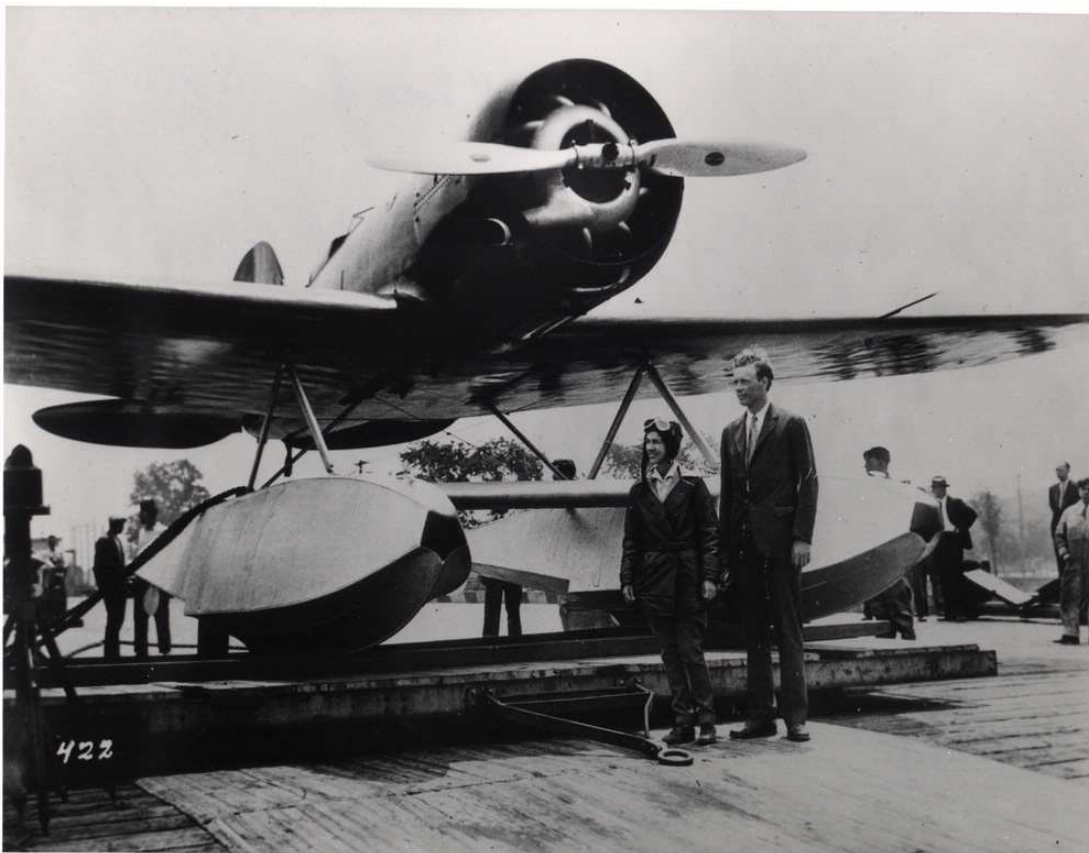
A new aviation education program will be announced by EAA at this year's convention. EAA AeroEducate is a new program designed to keep kids engaged in aviation regardless of their location or proximity to an airport.

AeroEducate is a web-based resource that will provide clear, age-appropriate pathways to aviation, aerospace, and potential career paths. It is designed for kids 5 to 18 years old, and will include easy to use aviation themed activities for teachers and EAA chapters, whether in school or at the airport.

Among the elements of AeroEducate are:

- Badging Program – Participate in aviation, earn badging for continued engagement and continued discovery in aviation
- Career Pathways – Demystifies the journey, regardless of area of aviation interest.
- Classroom Activities – Aviation infused to help educators spark interest among youth.
- Database of Youth Aviation Activities – Creating nationwide opportunities to participate.
