# **Simulated Spaceflight Study**

---

Dear EAA members and aviation enthusiasts,

**Have you ever wanted to experience spaceflight but thought that was only for astronauts?** The University of Texas Medical Branch is looking for regular people - including those with common health conditions - to experience simulated launch and landing for a **centrifuge study planned in early 2022 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.**

My name is Karen Ong, and I am a resident in space and aerospace medicine at the University of Texas Medical Branch (Galveston, TX). I'm also a private pilot who recently moved to Texas from New York City. My program trains physicians to take care of pilots and astronauts, and we are looking to learn more about sending regular people to space. We are putting on a study (tentatively Jan-Feb 2022) where we plan to spin people with diabetes/heart arrhythmias (and a limited number without) in a giant centrifuge in Philadelphia to the high g-forces of launch and landing. (And yes, this is the same kind of centrifuge that astronauts and fighter pilots train in!).

We've previously successfully done this with older adults, type 1 diabetics on insulin pumps, an amputee, and even people born with heart defects - but we are looking to learn even more. If you or the members of your chapter are interested in helping us out and experience what spaceflight feels like, I am happy to give a presentation online to your chapter to tell you more about what we know, what the study plans to do, and how to apply. (Or if you want to apply, please send an email to [kmong@utmb.edu](mailto:kmong@utmb.edu) and cc it to [rsblue@utmb.edu](mailto:rsblue@utmb.edu) with the subject "centrifuge study" and we will send you the application).

Unfortunately, we cannot compensate participants for travel or the study itself, but you will get to experience centrifuge-simulated launch and landing - an experience very few people have had the chance to have! And what's more - you'll be helping us pave the way for even more people to go to space safely.

I'm excited about the study and happy to answer any questions you or your members might have.
